Dear Representatives Collins, Schakowsky, Kind, Tiberi, Harper, Kelly, and Meehan,

On behalf of the 44 undersigned organizations representing the Nursing Community, we would like to thank you for introducing the Home Health Care Planning Improvement Act of 2017 (H.R. 1825). The members of the Nursing Community coalition are the cross section of education, practice, research, and regulation within the nursing profession and fully support the goal of this legislation. With over four million licensed Registered Nurses (RNs), Advanced Practice Registered Nurses (APRNs), and nursing students, the profession embodies the drive and passion to continually improve care for patients, families, and communities. The coalition is committed to improving the health of our nation and believes H.R. 1825 helps to achieve this end.

APRNs provide cost effective, high-quality care and have been recognized Medicare providers for over twenty years. Home health is an area where APRNs are especially relied upon for their expert clinical skills. Yet, as it currently stands, Medicare law prohibits APRNs from certifying Medicare patients for home health benefits and from signing home health plans of care. The Home Health Care Planning Improvement Act of 2017 would allow nurse practitioners, certified nurse-midwives, and clinical nurse specialists to certify these services, ultimately reducing delays in care and recovery.

Again, we commend the introduction of H.R. 1825, and appreciate your support for America's patients by reducing barriers that impede access to quality care.
